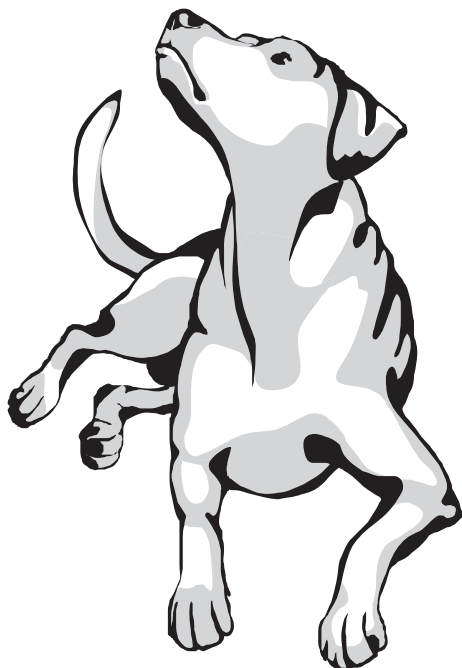
ON ARRIVAL AT THE CLINIC
